The **Lourdes Building Our Future** campaign has **passed the \$11.5M mark!** This means that we have “\$3.5M to Go...” to reach the fundraising goal of \$15M and to move forward with realizing the dream of a new Lourdes High School. On May 5, more than 150 people who have already made gift to the **Lourdes Building Our Future** campaign came together for a Cinco de Mayo Fiesta and to hear exciting updates.

Announcement!

The campaign has passed the \$11.5M mark, thanks to three generous gifts made to the campaign in recent weeks. Two of those visionary and generous donors are **Ron and Dianne Yanish**. Ron and Dianne are truly kind and down-to-earth people. Their dedication to Catholic education stems from the experience of their adult children who are LHS alumni. Catholic education continues to provide strong faith formation and quality academics for Ron and Dianne’s grandsons who are now RCS students. The Yanish’s truly see young people as our future and as the only REAL legacy we leave. Ron and Dianne are choosing to honor the Sisters of St. Francis with their gift. The new high school will include the “Our Lady of

Lourdes Chapel honoring the Sisters of St. Francis—a gift from the Yanish Family.” Ron and Diane are also making a generous gift to establish a named scholarship with Lourdes Foundation so that they can ensure Lourdes doesn’t become “just a rich kids’ school.” They want to enable any family with the desire for Catholic education to be able to receive it.

Another Announcement!

The second announcement shared at the Cinco de Mayo Fiesta was that an extremely generous financial offer from Jack and Mary Ann Remick has been approved by Bishop John M. Quinn. The Remicks will provide a \$10M loan to Rochester Catholic Schools for the LBOF campaign to complete the financing needed to build the school. After the new high school is occupied, a second fundraising campaign will be conducted to pay back this loan over a period of years. Once \$5M is repaid, the next \$5M raised will be gifted by the Remicks back to LHS for scholarships.

Reflections

As I take a moment to ponder what has taken place in my professional life over the past forty-three years, I marvel at how many things have changed and even more those things that have not changed.

Forty-three years ago, when I began my teaching experience at Lourdes High School, there were approximately eighteen Sisters of St. Francis on staff at the school. There were also three to four priests from our Diocese and a "handful" of lay teachers. The addition that holds Alumni Hall, administration offices and the science floor did not exist. And the block north of the school was filled with single family homes, not student/faculty parking. The curriculum was a standard high school curriculum that served the student population reasonably well. And Lourdes was not a part of a system. RCS had not been formed.

With the growing educational needs of students and the rising cost to educate those students, it was deemed necessary for Lourdes to develop an educational niche to attract new students. From that need Lourdes became a college preparatory educational system accredited by the North Central Association Accrediting agency. Driven by the vision of Mr. Joe Mayer, Assistant Principal, flexible modular scheduling became a reality. That vision has assisted Lourdes in growing to the status in academic excellence that our students enjoy today. Approximately 98% of Lourdes graduates go on to college or university study.

Throughout my forty-three years, Our Lady of Lourdes High School has been operated for the sole purpose of providing quality Catholic education to all from the Rochester area that wish to attend. The dedication of the Sisters of Saint Francis, the Catholic parishes in the community and all the lay teachers and staff that have served the school has

assured that quality Catholic education will continue for many, many more years to follow. There is a constant and continuous effort to make this education affordable to all wishing to attend.

The constant dedication of families wishing only the best education for their children remains today as it was present forty-three years ago. As we move into the new Lourdes High School the wishes of these families will be realized in a state of the art facility that will assure the school's presence for many more years to come.

It has been an honor and privilege to have been a part of Lourdes High School for these many years. It is going to be grand to watch Lourdes grow. It's great to be an Eagle! May our Lady of Lourdes watch over and protect us all.

A Journey, A Transformation

This summer a group of Lourdes students will board a plane to Rome. They will not be tourists, however, off to experience the culture and sights of the Eternal City. Nor will they be just students, on a quest to learn about Roman history and civilization. This group is going on a pilgrimage. They are journeying to the living heart of Catholicism in order to walk and pray along the same pathways that millions of pilgrims have followed before them.

"The goal of the pilgrimage is to inhabit a new, sacred space so that they can grow in their faith," said Mrs. Martine Haglund of Lourdes High School, who is leading the pilgrimage. "We want to take them out of their comfort areas and put them somewhere that has special meaning for their faith as Catholics. The churches and other pilgrimage sites in Rome and Assisi offer a perfect opportunity to do just that."

Students on the pilgrimage will set aside many of the usual trappings of the tourist's life. They will be staying in a special guest house for pilgrims near the Vatican, so while comfortable, their accommodations will be simple. They will spend their days visiting churches and other important Christian sites, sharing meals and fellowship, and praying. Almost every day will include Mass, and the pilgrims will have a number of opportunities for reflection and meditation on what they have experienced. They have also set aside time to journey to Assisi to honor to the Franciscan heritage of Rochester Catholic Schools.

The pilgrims' guide in Rome will be Fr. Michael Maher, S.J. Fr. Maher teaches Catholic history at Gonzaga University and leads the University's Summer to Rome program. In addition to his expertise in Renaissance history, he has over 20 years experience leading students on pilgrimages like this one. Fr. Maher helped plan the itinerary, and he will help the students understand the significance of the various pilgrimage sites, as well as help the students appreciate what they experience throughout the journey. "We are so grateful for Fr. Maher's willingness to help," said Mrs. Haglund. "Having a priest of his experience and insight to guide us is something we could only have dreamed of when first conceiving this pilgrimage."

The pilgrimage formally began in March when the students visited Bishop John Quinn at the Sacred Heart Cathedral in Winona. The pilgrims attended Mass, shared a meal with the Bishop, and received his formal blessing. Bishop Quinn reminded the pilgrims that what they were doing was much different than a vacation or tour. Whereas a vacation is about emptying one's self, a pilgrimage is about filling one's self, reconnecting with our faith community. He urged the student-pilgrims to pray and open themselves to the chance to know their faith more deeply.

The pilgrims leave Rochester on June 16th and return on June 28th. We ask everyone in the Rochester Catholic Schools community for your prayer and support of what the pilgrimage organizers hope will become a regular journey for our RCS community.

"Thousands of years of Christians have walked in these places to *see* God in their lives," said Jenny Vondrashek, one of the pilgrims. "Maybe, just maybe, we will be able to *see* something, too."

The disease took her right leg and over a semester of her junior year, but it didn’t take her spirit. Currently in a wheelchair, one of her goals was achieved when she was able to use a new prosthetic leg

for Grand March at prom. Kelly is proud of her resilient friend. “She’s the only one who could have handled it,” she claims, “prom is going to be a big step for her.”

Lourdes played an important role in Hanna’s life this past year. Students raised funds for a new accessible home, teachers emailed homework assignments while she was in the hospital,

and tutors helped her with math and Spanish. Even when she returned to classes, the school put the two friends on the same schedule in case Hanna needed any help during the day. “But I can do everything on my own now,” she says with an assuredness that anyone would envy.

It should come as no surprise that, despite all the challenges, they haven’t neglected their academics or extracurricular involvement. Hanna is on the A Honor Roll and president of the junior class. She’ll run for president of the student body next year and figure out a way to stay involved with the soccer team. Kelly plays soccer each year and enjoys biology and math. Both girls are interested in veterinary school. Where will they study? According to Kelly, “We’re not exactly sure where we want to go.”



Jahi Moore



Jahi Moore is a bit of a rock star. Seriously, he played drums at the Lourdes annual rock concert called *Rock-insania* the past two years, playing with a band called The Clip-On Ties this year. His interest in playing started in sixth grade, when he saw the movie *Drumline*. Now a senior, he’s had four years in band and winter drumline. The group competed in Dayton, Ohio for the world championships for drumline, where he met some of his favorite drummers.

He’s interested in becoming a director in Drum Corps International and owning his own drum corps. The percussion program at Lourdes will help him achieve that dream, and it will help fund his studies at Norfolk State University next year, which he chose for their excellent drumline and music program.
